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# LESSON ONE

## HOW TO MEMORIZE SCRIPTURE

### **I. How to Succeed in Scripture Memorization.**

#### **A. Gaining Knowledge of God's Word Takes Time and Effort.**

1. There is no easy road to success.
2. Study, application, and patience are needed to learn God's Word.

#### **B. Because the Average Mind Is Lazy, It Must Be Stirred to Action Through Determination, which Is an Essential Ingredient to Memorization.**

#### **C. The Mind Must Be Disciplined to Make It an Obedient Servant.**

1. The mind can be trained.
2. There is no limit to the capacity of the memory.

#### **D. First Attempts to Memorize May Be Difficult (Luke 9:62).**

1. Do not become discouraged in first attempts.
2. Believe God for the quickening of the mind.

#### **E. To Memorize, Thorough Work Is Required in the Beginning.**

1. Begin in a small way.
2. Read a passage thoughtfully several times before attempting to memorize it.
3. Grasp the meaning of the text as a whole.

#### **F. One or More Passages Should Be Memorized Systematically Every Day (Acts 17:11; Hebrews 4:12).**

#### **G. Master the Art of Retaining What You Have Learned by Using Verses as They Are Memorized.**

#### **H. Keeping a Joyful Attitude Toward the Work Involved in Memorizing Makes Learning Easier.**

### **II. How to Use the Card System of Scripture Memorization.**

#### **A. Start by Choosing and Arranging the Scriptures to Be Memorized.**

1. Use cards of a uniform size. Index cards may be used full size or cut in half.
2. List the reference on one side and the Scripture to be memorized on the other.

#### **B. Make an Arrangement of Scriptures for Review.**

1. Those verses thoroughly mastered may be reviewed once a week.
2. Previews may be further divided into monthly, semi-monthly, and quarterly divisions.
3. Failure to recall a reference or a passage correctly calls for putting it back into the daily review list.

**C. The Greatest Success Depends upon Faithfully and Persistently Following Reviews.**

**III. Using the Card System for Memorizing Scripture Has Many Merits.**

**A. A Card System Can Be Used Any Time or Place.**

1. Cards can be reviewed anywhere or at any time.
2. Use early morning hours to review while your mind is fresh.
3. If possible, review aloud when you are alone.

**B. Using a Card System Saves Time.**

**C. Having the Scripture Handy for Review Is Conducive to Accuracy in Quoting. (Misquoted Scriptures Weaken One's Influence with the Unsaved.)**

**D. Using the Card System Breaks up Unnecessary Mental Associations.**

**E. The Card System Trains the Mind to Recall Instantly Both the Location (Chapter and Verse) and the Scripture.**

**IV. The Card System of Scripture Memorization May Be Utilized as a Teaching Tool in Sunday School and Youth Groups, as Well as Home Studies.**

# Lesson Two

## Scripture Memorization for Growth and Service

### I. Scriptures Prove that Believers Need to Grow in Grace.

#### A. God's Word Provides the Substance Christians Need to Grow in Grace and in the Knowledge of Christ.

1. God's Word commands Christians to grow (II Peter 3:18).
2. God's Word tells Christians how to grow (I Peter 2:2).
3. Spiritual growth is dependent upon the Word of God (Matthew 4:4).
4. Memorizing the Living Word brings joy and strength (Jeremiah 15:16; Job 23:12; Philippians 3:10).

#### B. Believers Are Cleansed from the Defilement and the Power of Sin by God's Word.

1. Through daily contact with the Word, believers are sanctified (John 17:17).
2. Through daily contact with the Word, believers are cleansed (Psalm 119:9; John 15:3).

#### C. Christians Are Able to Meet Satan's Attacks by Using God's Word.

1. Christians must put on the whole armour of God (Ephesians 6:11,17).
2. Christians are delivered from the power of sin by hiding God's Word in their hearts (Psalm 119:11).

#### D. God's Word Is the Source of All True Wisdom.

1. Wisdom is for all who ask (James 1:5; I Corinthians 1:20).
2. The Apostle James defined true Wisdom (James 3:17).
3. God's Word reveals the hidden treasures of Wisdom (Colossians 2:3).
4. Searching the Scriptures, daily, imparts Wisdom (Acts 17:11).

#### E. God's Word Provides the Only Right Perspective of Life and Duty.

1. Faithful observance of the Word brings prosperity (Joshua 1:8).
2. God's Word contrasts the spiritual and carnal man (Psalm 1:1-6).
3. Believers are to be doers of God's Word (James 1:22).
4. God's Word provides light for believers (Psalm 119:105).
5. God's Word provides the only right perspective of life and duty (Joshua 1:8; Psalm 1:1-3; James 1:22; Acts 15:18).

### II. Personal Work Is Important in the Christian's Growth and Service.

#### A. Our Lord Dealt with Individuals: Nicodemus (John 3:1-21) and the Samaritan Woman (John 4:1-30).

#### B. All Christians Can Do Personal Work (Acts 8:3,4).

#### C. Many People Can Be Reached only Through Personal Work (Luke 14:23).

#### D. Personal Witnessing to Christ's Power to Save Increases the Christian's Usefulness in Soul Winning

(John 4:29,39).

# Lesson Four

- I. Show the Unsaved Their Need of a Saviour Because People Do not Want to Be Saved Until They Realize Their Need of a Saviour (Romans 3:22,23; Isaiah 53:6; Galatians 3:10).
- II. Show the Unsaved that Without Christ They Already Are Condemned and Lost (John 3:18,36).
- III. Show the Unsaved that Morality Will not Save Them (Matthew 22:37,38; Galatians 3:10; James 2:10).
- IV. Show the Unsaved that Without Christ There Is No Peace (Isaiah 57:20,21).
- V. Show the Unsaved What Jesus Christ Has Done for Them (Isaiah 53:4,5; I Peter 2:24; John 3:16).
- VI. Show the Unsaved the Final Consequences of Sin and Warn Them of Coming Judgment (Hebrews 10:28,29; II Thessalonians 1:7-9; Revelation 21:8; Romans 3:3; Matthew 25:41,46; Revelation 20:15; 14:10,11).

# Lesson Five

## Dealing with Lost Souls Who Are under Conviction of Sin

### Introduction

Those who realize their need of a Saviour must know three things:

- They must be led to see that they are LOST sinners.
- They must be made to see that CHRIST is the ONLY SAVIOUR.
- They must be led to a definite acceptance and confession of Christ as Saviour and LORD.

**I. Show the Sinner How to Accept Christ as His/Her Saviour (Isaiah 53:6; John 1:12; Romans 10:8,10; Matthew 10:32).**

**II. Show the Sinner that There Must Be a Willingness to Confess and Forsake Sin (Isaiah 55:7; Acts 2:38; Hebrews 7:25; I Corinthians 10:13).**

**III. Show the Sinner What It Means to Believe on Jesus Christ for Salvation (Acts 16:31; Romans 1:16; I Corinthians 15:1-4).**

**IV. After Having Led a Soul to Christ, Give Him/Her a Few Scriptures on which to Rest His/Her Faith (Acts 10:43; 13:39; John 3:36; 5:24).**

# Lesson Six

## Dealing with Souls Who Lack Assurance of Their Salvation

### I. Some Souls Do not Have Assurance of Their Salvation Because:

- A. They Are Ignorant of God's Word (Romans 10:17; Ephesians 2:8,9; I Peter 1:8).
- B. They Are Seeking Salvation Through Their Own Good Works (Romans 3:19,20).
- C. They Are not Willing to Do God's Will (James 5:17).
- D. They Are Looking for *Feeling* as a Basis of Assurance (Romans 1:16).
- E. They Seem to Think that Having Absolute Assurance of Salvation Is Impossible (I John 3:2).
- F. They Joined the Church Without Being Born Again (I John 3:21; I John 3:9).

### II. Believers May Know that They Have Eternal Life Because:

A. God's Testimony in His Word Assures Believers of Eternal Life (I John 5:13; John 20:30,31; Romans 15:4).

1. Believers may know that their sins are forgiven because the Word of God attests to this fact (Acts 10:43).
2. Believers may know that they are justified from all things because God's Word asserts that they are (Acts 13:39; Romans 4:25).
3. Believers may know that they have become a child of God because God's Word affirms it (John 1:12).
4. Believers may know that they have everlasting life because God's Word assures them of this Truth (John 3:36; 5:24; I John 5:10; John 10:27-29).

B. Believers' Changed Lives Are Testimonies to God's Power to Give Them Eternal Life (Romans 8:9; II Corinthians 5:17; I John 3:14).

C. The Witness of the Holy Spirit also Assures Believers of Eternal Life (Romans 8:16; Galatians 5:22,23).

### III. Believers Can Obtain the Assurance of Eternal Life.

A. They Must Believe on the LORD Jesus Christ (Acts 16:31; I John 5:13; John 12:42,43; Romans 10:9,10).

B. They Must Read What God Says in His Word about Eternal Life (I John 5:13).

C. They Must Accept by Faith What God's Word Says (John 5:24).

- B. Show the Great Sinner the Purpose of Christ's Coming into the World.
  1. Jesus Christ came to call Sinners to repentance (Matthew 9:12,13; Luke 15:1,2).
  2. Jesus Christ came to save the lost (Luke 19:10; I Timothy 1:15; Hebrews 2:9).

- C. Doing Despite unto the Holy Spirit Is a Sin (Hebrews 10:28,29).
- D. Resisting the Holy Spirit Is a Sin (Acts 7:51; 9:5).
- E. Blaspheming the Holy Spirit Is a Sin (Matthew 12:31,32; Matthew 12:24; Mark 3:22; Luke 11:15).

### III. How You Can Help Souls Who Feel They Have Committed the Unpardonable Sin.

- A. Show Them How to Remove Their Burden of Sin (II Timothy 2:24-26).
- B. Present Them the Gospel Invitation to Be Saved (John 6:27; (Matthew 11:28-30; II Peter 3:9; Revelation 22:17).
- C. Warn the Obstinate Against Resisting the Holy Spirit (Hebrews 3:15; Acts 4:12).
- D. Warn the Procrastinator Against Delay (I Corinthians 12:3).

# Lesson Nine

## Instructing the New Convert

### I. There Are Some Things New Converts Must Do.

- A. They Must Trust in Christ Alone for Salvation.
- B. They Must Confess Christ before Men (Matthew 10:32,33; Romans 10:9,10).
- C. They Must Unite with the Church of God's Choosing (Acts 2:47).
- D. They Must Feed on the Word of God Daily (I Peter 2:2; Acts 17:11; Psalm 119:11).
- E. They Must Establish the Habit of Daily Prayer (Matthew 7:11; James 4:2; Isaiah 40:31; I Thessalonians 5:17; Jeremiah 33:3; Matthew 7:7,8; John 14:13,14; 15:7,16; James 5:16; I John 5:14,15).
- F. They Must Form a Habit of Christian Giving (Leviticus 27:30-32; I Corinthians 16:2; II Corinthians 8:12; II Corinthians 9:6,7).

- H. They Must Confess All Sins to God and, when Necessary, Make Restitution (Proverbs 28:13; Acts 24:16; I John 1:9).
- I. They Must Learn the Relation of Faith to Works (Acts 13:39; Galatians 5:6; James 2:14,17; Matthew 7:20).
- J. They Must Take up Some Definite Line of Christian Service (Philippians 2:12,13; I Corinthians 3:11-15).

### II. There Are Some Things New Converts Must NOT Do.

- A. New Converts Must not Permit Any Known or Willful Sin to Go Unrepented (I John 3:4,9; James 4:17; Romans 14:22).
- B. New Converts Must not Conform to the Christ-Rejecting World (I John 2:15-17; James 4:4; John 15:18,19; II Corinthians 5:17).
  - 1. They must not go where their minds will be defiled by sin (James 1:27).
  - 2. They must not do anything which they would be unwilling to be found doing when Jesus Christ comes (Luke 21:34-36).
  - 3. They must not desecrate the LORD's Day (Exodus 20:8,9).
- C. New Converts Must not Grieve nor Quench the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 4:30; I Thessalonians 5:19).
- D. New Converts Must not Do Anything Which Does not Glorify God (I Corinthians 10:31; Isaiah 5:20,21; I Corinthians 6:19,20).

# Lesson Ten

## Requirements for Soul Winning

**I. Soul Winners Need to Have the Assurance of Salvation (I John 5:13; John 10:27-30).**

**II. Soul Winners Need to Be Sanctified Believers.**

**A. They Need to Have Clean Hearts and Lives (II Timothy 2:21; Isaiah 59:1,2; John 17:17; Ephesians 5:26,27).**

**B. They Need to Have Surrendered Wills to God (Romans 12:1,2; I Corinthians 6:19,20)**

**III. Soul Winners Need to Have a Practical Knowledge of the Bible (Ephesians 6:17; II Timothy 3:16,17; 2:15).**

**IV. Soul Winners Need Power in Prayer.**

**A. They Need to Pray for an Understanding of God's Word (Psalm 119:18).**

**B. They Need to Pray for the Leading of the Holy Spirit (Acts 8:29; Romans 8:14; Psalm 32:8).**

**C. They Need to Pray that the Holy Spirit Will Help Them Remember the Scriptures They Have Memorized (John 14:26).**

**D. They Need to Pray that God Will Give Power to the Message They Share with Others (Isaiah 55:11).**

**E. They Need to Pray for Those Who Have Been Led to Christ so that They May Grow to Spiritual Maturity**

**V. Soul Winners Need to Have the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.**

**A. The Promise of the Spirit Is to All Believers (Acts 1:4,5,8,9; Luke 24:49; Matthew 3:11; Acts 2:7,38,39; II Corinthians 1:20).**

**B. Is Conversion the Same as the Baptism of the Holy Ghost? (John 16:7; 13:10; Acts 8:5-12,17; Acts 19:2; Romans 8:9; John 14:16,17).**

**C. Is Speaking in Tongues the Evidence of Receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost?**

1. God never has bestowed a gift with a sign other than with the Gift of the Holy Ghost, as far as the scriptural record is concerned (I Corinthians 12:1-31; Acts 2:1-4).

2. Nowhere in Scripture is ANY OTHER GIFT mentioned ALONE in connection with receiving the Holy Ghost.

3. Speaking in tongues as the initial physical evidence that one has received the Holy Ghost is the same in essence and origin as the gift of tongues listed in First Corinthians, chapter twelve, but is different in purpose and use.

4. The GIFT of the Holy Ghost is an experience which comes as a Baptism, ONCE, to the believer; AFTERWARD, God's plans include giving other gifts listed in I Corinthians 12:1-10.

5. None of these gifts, in I Corinthians 12:1-10, has ceased. All are available to God's people today, as is the Gift of the Holy Ghost (Ephesians 4:12,13; I Corinthians 13:8,9,10).

6. The Apostle Paul instructed believers in the use of tongues as a *gift*. Any number of people can have the gift of tongues, but when messages in tongues are given, they should be by two, or at the most by three, and that by course (one at a time). A message in tongues should be interpreted, or else the speaker should keep silence in the church (I Corinthians 14:27).

7. Prophecy is not the evidence of receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, for Prophets from Enoch to Malachi prophesied before the Holy Ghost was sent (II Peter 1:21).

8. Gifts of healing and miracles do not serve as the evidence of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, for Elijah and Elisha both healed the sick, raised the dead, and worked miracles before the Day of Pentecost.

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## Before Pentecost

### Elijah

1. Caused it not to rain for 3 1/2 years, then caused it to rain (I Kings 17:1; James 5:17,18).
2. Miraculously fed the widow of Zarephath (I Kings 17:16).
3. Raised the Widow's son from the dead (I Kings 17:23).
4. Divided waters of Jordan (II Kings 2:8).

### Elisha

1. Parted Jordan's Waters (II Kings 2:14).
2. Healed deathly waters and barren land (II Kings 2:21,22).
3. Filled new ditches with water (II Kings 3:16,17).
4. Filled widow woman's vessels with oil (II Kings 4:5,6).
5. Healed Shunammite woman's barrenness (II Kings 4:16,17).
6. Raised Shunammite woman's son from the dead (II Kings 4:35).
7. Healed death in the pot of wild gourds (II Kings 4:40,41).
8. Healed Naaman the leper (II Kings 5:14).

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9. No other gifts could serve as the evidence of the Holy Ghost. Daniel was given Wisdom (Daniel 2:14); Knowledge (Daniel 2:28); interpretation (Daniel 5:26); faith (Hebrews 11:33). Elisha *discerned* the greedy spirit of Gehazi (II Kings 6:26).

10. Of no other gift can it be said truthfully that it began on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 10:46; 11:15-17). Did the Apostle Paul speak with tongues? Acts 9:17 does not mention it; however, we know he did, since he had the power to lay hands on others for them to receive the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other tongues (Acts 19:6). Moreover, the Apostle testified that he spoke in tongues more than all the saints in the Corinthian Church (I Corinthians 14:18). The Apostle Paul's testimony and experience proves that he spoke in tongues WHEN HE WAS BAPTIZED WITH THE HOLY GHOST.

### D. Do All Speak in Tongues?

1. On the Day of Pentecost, when the Holy Ghost was given, the Apostles, the women, Mary the Mother of Jesus, and His brethren, all spoke with other tongues (Acts 1:13-15; 2:1-4).

2. About eight years later, for the first time, Peter preached the Gospel to the Gentiles, and a group of friends and kinsmen of Cornelius received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost (Acts 10:43,44).

3. Six Jewish believers who had come with Peter from Joppa spoke in tongues (Acts 10:46; 11:12,15,17).

4. Twenty years after the Day of Pentecost, Paul, in his missionary work, came to Ephesus where a group of believers, who never had heard that there was any thing like the Holy Ghost, received the Spirit with the evidence of speaking in tongues (Acts 19:1-6).

5. At Ephesus, twelve spake with tongues, and at the house of Cornelius, all who heard the Word began to speak with other tongues during the sermon, and there is no record that any of it was interpreted. This indicates that, for the first time, the people in Ephesus and those in the house of Cornelius, when they heard that the Holy Ghost was being poured out on believers, experienced the Baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

## **VI. God's Word Gives Instructions for Receiving the Holy Ghost.**

**A. Everyone Must Have Faith in Order to Believe in the Holy Ghost (Luke 11:13; James 1:6,7; Mark 11:24).**

**B. Believers Must Remove All Hindrances to Faith. Sin, Disobedience, and Self-will Destroy (or Murder) Faith (I John 3:21; Isaiah 59:1; Psalm 66:18).**

**C. Believers Must Be Obedient (Acts 5:32; I Timothy 2:8).**

The Holy Spirit is "*given to them who obey Him.*" Believers must present unto God pure hearts and clean hands.

**D. Believers Must not Resist God's Holy Spirit (Acts 7:51).**

Resist the Devil, and he will flee from you. Get rid of pride because it will hinder a believer from being filled with the Holy Ghost.

**E. Believers Must Yield Their Hearts to God.**
